The School and Community

Archbishop Hoban High School is a Roman Catholic, coeducational, college preparatory high school located on 75 acres in East Akron, Ohio and serves 849 students. On average 99 percent of seniors enroll in a two or four-year college following graduation. Hoban is committed to making Catholic education available to an economically, academically and ethnically diverse student population. The Brothers of Holy Cross founded the school in 1953 to serve boys from grades 9 through 12. In 1973, the school became coed. In 1976, the lay Board of Directors assumed major governance responsibilities. The Board continues to work with the Brothers, who now sponsor the school.

Ohio Graduation Test (OGT)

The Class of 2012 is mandated to pass the five sections of the OGT. As of September 2011, 212 of 216 seniors have met this requirement. In previous classes, all seniors passed all sections of the OPT or OGT required for graduation.

Rank in Class

Hoban's class rank and cumulative GPA include all courses students take. Historically, due to its quality students and rigorous curriculum, even students ranking in the lowest quintile have been accepted and have succeeded in higher education. Colleges should analyze carefully not only the transcript, but also the student description, faculty recommendations and school profile.
