The Hoban Knights boys basketball team are Division I state champions!

The Knights defeated Toledo St. John's Jesuit in a state semifinal on March 18 at the University of Dayton Arena, and returned one night later to knock off defending state champion Pickerington Central, 53-47. The victory gave Hoban its first basketball state championship since 1989, and its first in Division I in school history. Their tournament run produced many records and firsts. The Knights won a boys basketball district championship in back-to-back years for the first time ever, and victories over St. Edward and Walsh Jesuit earned the program's first regional championship since 1998. The basketball team finished its historic season with an overall record of 26-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season. Congratulations to coach T.K. Griffith and this outstanding group of student-athletes and coaches!

A Message from Principal T.K. Griffith '89

I don't know if you heard, but Hoban won a Division I OHSAA state championship in boys basketball last week. Lol. This is tongue in cheek, of course, as it seems as if the celebration has continued to roll on indefinitely with invitations that range from the parade in downtown Akron to the Columbus statehouse to Channel 8 news station, the Rubberducks, Channel 5, Summit County Council and beyond. I never dreamed of this, to be honest. Never imagined it either.

The main lesson I can glean from it is the benefit that comes by just putting your head down and working. That's all I have done for 30 years at Hoban, and all so many others who are here now or who went before me do, did or model/ed. From Brother Ed and Brother Joe, to Sister Kathleen King to Helen Trares, to Dr. Beiting and Brother Ken...to Joe Lutz, Ralph Orsini, Judy Mohan and Pachy Bell...I'll stop there...but so many people at Hoban have taught me to just put your head down and work on what needs to be done "today" to impact the kids in front of us. That's the spirit I have attempted to bring to my daily work at Hoban. That daily work, when done right, becomes prayer. And one day when you look up from the work, beautiful results lie in front of you.

One finger cannot lift a pebble. I used this aphorism to motivate our team on our tourney run because it spoke to me in several ways and connected to a rock that sat in my office for years. The rock has the words "Hoban Family" on it and was used in a Holy Cross retreat years ago as a motivational tactic for the faculty. It spoke to me, so I decided to place it in my pocket during the entire tournament, coaching with it and practicing with it on my person. The message of the "One Finger" line is that we cannot do it alone. I wanted our team to know they could lean on each other, taking the pressure off of individual expectations. Time and time again, different kids stepped up and contributed. Whether it was Brody Franjesh delivering a pre-game talk titled "Opportunity" before the Massillon game, or Will Scott scoring 57 points against Massillon and St. Ed's, or Andrew leading us in the district final with 15 points...or Sam Greer never backing down from Mr. Basketball...or Joey Hardman and Colin Coyne with timely three's, or Jonas Nichols rebounding, assisting and attracting a lot of attention from the opponent, Lamar Sperling modeling sacrifice and team, Josh Greer's intensity, Nate Korwin's vibrance, Mookie Barclay's love of team, Logan Vowles sharpshooting and 17 points in the championship game, and even James and Kam practicing with the varsity...each player helped lift that pebble/rock.

On the white board before the final game, I wrote "Allow the Hoban family to carry you!"

And you did. Like the Footprints poem, the Hoban family carried us through this journey. And we have so much gratitude for this experience.

Undoubtedly, this was an example of the power of divine providence and family. Undoubtedly, there was a spiritual influence. I never have felt the love or support of the Hoban family like we have after this experience. I lost count but we are near 500 texts and emails and new ones roll in each day. To me, this moment was just the result of looking up from the daily work and being pleasantly surprised at the results. To me, this was the power of the Hoban family at its finest.

How God Has Walked With Me Through High School



Mexico Immersion 2023

Hoban students Maria Church, Kylene Coyne, Mateo DeCola, Sofia DeCola, Nylah Durham, Olivia Osmun and Roland Sturgill were chaperoned by Sra. Zeller, Sra. Bell and Sr. DeCola on a Mexico Immersion Trip in February. The group visited La Luz parish, sister parish of Holy Cross (Santa Cruz) in Monterrey Mexico. Students spent seven days working with the parish churches of Monterrey, attending Mass each evening at a different one, following Padre (Father) Pedro Carreño, the host, along with Fathers Armando and Marín.

Students delivered nonperishable foods to homes of parishioners who could not make it to the church and spoke with these community members to learn about them. Students prepared a party for younger children in Las Sabanitas, a poor part of Monterrey. The students brought stickers, temporary tattoos, coloring books and crayons for the children and played with them for two hours. One afternoon was spent playing and connecting with the teens (ages 14-21) of La Luz parish participating in "Vacation Bible Study" type of activities and getting to know the teens. The group had the opportunity to view the different programs offered by the churches, like medical services, bible study, and even had a day to tour Monterrey and take in its beauty, as well as to eat at some local "taquerías". One evening the group was invited to the house of the Vargas family where students enjoyed a home cooked fiesta complete with decorations and a near life-sized piñata. Each evening the group had time to reflect on the day's events with Padre Pedro. Students were able to use their Spanish skills to communicate and learn about the people and the community.

Students compete in MathFest

Ten Hoban students represented Hoban at Youngstown State University's MathFest in March. MathFest celebrates the beauty and power of mathematics, allowing students to compete in individual and team contests. Students also attended a variety of math workshops with roughly 300 mathematically-minded students from about 25 schools in Northeast Ohio and Western Pennsylvania.
