CONGRATULATIONS HOBAN NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS



Three Hoban seniors--Thomas Crowe, Alaina Lah and Isabelle Hahn--have been named National Merit Semifinalists in the 2021 National Merit Scholarship Competition. In addition, students designated as Commended Students will be announced in mid-September. Hoban is proud to have a long-standing tradition of naming more students recognized by the National Merit Scholarship Program than any other school in Summit County. Every October, approximately 1.6 million juniors across the country take the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT). Students who score in the top one percent achieve the distinction of National Merit Semifinalist. Most of these students move on to become National Merit Finalists, with some winning scholarship money for college.

2020-21 Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion installed

AP classes help students acquire the skills and habits needed to be successful in college. They help students improve writing skills, sharpen problem-solving abilities and develop time management skills, discipline and study habits.

Senior wins prestigious art award

Clara Krohn was announced the winner of the prestigious 2020 Congressional Art Competition in June for her piece *Shades of Charlotte*. Her art teacher, Jill Fortman, said that it is very rare for a student to win this award. "It was my first student ever to do so in 25 years."







The Akron-Summit Council on Holocaust and Genocide Education awarded junior Grace Kostko second place last April in the Visual Art Division II (9th-12th Grades) for her mixed media drawing entitled *Nothing Changes When Nothing Changes.* The theme of the Art and Writing Contest was Lessons of the Holocaust: Then and Now--Stories of Refugees and Upstanders. Kostko's piece positions a contemporary immigrant woman with her child juxtaposed in front of newspaper clippings taken from the early 20th century. Unfortunately, if you read the clips, they could be taken from our newspapers about 100 years later.

100th win for Boys Soccer Coach Muresan

Tavi Muresan led the varsity boys soccer team to a huge win over Walsh Jesuit with a final score of 3-0. The Tuesday, Sept. 15, game brings his Hoban coaching record to 100-41-23. Octavian Muresan, a highly decorated coach with experience as a player and coach at the international level, joined Hoban as the varsity coach in 2011. He is a native of Reteag, Romania, and a 1989 graduate of Babes-Bolyai University, where he received a bachelor's degree in chemistry. He played professional soccer in Romania from 1983 to 1993. He became an American citizen in October 2013. His goal is to challenge his players to serve as role models and to be ambassadors for Hoban. Under his leadership the Hoban boys program won North Coast League League titles in 2013, 2016, 2018 and 2019. He was named NCL Coach of the Year in 2013, 2018 and 2019.
