When is registration? During English class, each Junior will meet with a counselor to complete the Senior Year Course Selection process.
How should I prepare for my registration meeting? Please take this form home to discuss with your parents. When you arrive for the registration meeting, please know the electives you would like to take. Review your 4 -year plan to guarantee you are making wise choices.
How do students register? The counselor will know the recommendations made by current teachers. Core and elective courses will be discussed. Students will receive a printout to review and return, signed by your parents. Students will have the option to complete a Waiver if there is disagreement with the recommended courses. The Course Catalog is on the Hoban website. (Quicklinks > Forms and Downloads > Course Catalog)

If needed, when would the Waiver be due? The Waiver is to be submitted on February 23, at the same time as the signed printout. Waiver forms can be found on the Hoban website. (Quicklinks > Forms and Downloads > Student Services Documents>Course Waiver Form) Copies are also available in the Central Office.
How many classes do I have to take? Students must take six classes each semester. With six classes, a study hall can be in the daily schedule, at which time they can access tutoring and other services.
Can I take 7 classes? Yes, students are encouraged to take a $7^{\text {th }}$ class. However, students who choose seven classes must plan how to finish daily assignments outside of school hours. Consider all time obligations such as co-curricular activities, work and family.
How many years of a world language do I need? Although Hoban does not require a world language for graduation, most colleges recommend two to three years of the same world language. If a student is already taking a world language and is doing well and enjoying the class, they are recommended to continue. If a student is not doing well, it is acceptable to discontinue after the second year.
What are Advanced Placement (AP) and College Credit Plus (CCP) courses?
AP and CCP courses offer an opportunity for a student to receive college credit in addition to their credit at Hoban. We encourage students to challenge themselves. However, Honors, CCP, and AP level courses require additional time and effort. Please consider your motivation and time limitation when registering for multiple Honors, AP, and/or CCP courses.

Students taking an Advanced Placement (AP) course receive credit based on their score from a summative exam taken in May. Each college decides if credit is earned, based on the score. Families are responsible for the cost of the AP exam.

The State of Ohio can cover the cost of College Credit Plus (CCP) courses for the college credit. On February 23rd at 6:00 PM, a webinar will be held to explain the important steps required for state funding.

A reminder of the requirements for the PE Waiver. All students must have the equivalent of two PE courses at 0.25 credits each for graduation. Students who have chosen the PE Waiver, in lieu of PE classes, are required to complete two full sport seasons. Students who become injured or academically ineligible will not receive credit for the season.

Both sport seasons should be completed by the end of sophomore year or enrollment in a Physical Education class will be necessary to assure the graduation requirement can be met. During registration, current Sophomores who have not completed the PE waiver will be enrolled in a PE class for their Junior year. If the PE waive is completed during the Spring athletic season, a student may schedule an appointment with their counselor to submit the completed waiver and register for a different elective. Please note: one sport season and one PE class is not permitted to fulfill the requirement.
