

#### PRE-HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT TEST May 7


The pre-HSPT provides seventh-grade students to take a practice test. Hoban will use the test score for enrollment and merit-based scholarships to Hoban in 2023 or you can choose to take the test again as an eighth-grade student. HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT TEST PREP COURSE AND TEST SUMMER CAMP JUNE 6 – 9

Students will learn the study skills needed to score well on the high school placement test Monday through Wednesday, 9 a.m. - noon. # Horton '04 speaks at new 'Voices in the Crowd' series

Hoban presented the second of a new speaker series called *Voices in the Crowd* in March. Hoban graduate Ashley Horton '04 joined Voices in the Crowd via Zoom from Pittsburgh where she practices law. Ashley was an incredible student-athlete at Hoban who then played basketball and studied law at Case Western Reserve University. She talked about women in leadership and her journey to success.

Ashley focuses her practice on railroad defense, with a particular emphasis on the Federal Employers Liability Act (FELA) and occupational disease illigation. She has been a member of several trial teams obtaining defense verdicts in FELA iltigation. In addition, she is well versed in matters relating to product liability and general filligation, including medical malpractice and nursing home defense, as well as insurance defense. She litigates cases in multiple state and federal courts across the country. Her previous experience includes practicing at a firm specializing in defense of Class I and short line railroads including Norfolk Southern, CSX, and Conrail, as well as other companies, suppliers, and manufactures, in a variety of complex toxic and mass tort claims involving occupational injuries under FELA. Ashley was selected as a 2020 Fellow by the Leadership Council on Legal Diversity (LCLD) where joined a select group of young attorneys carefully chosen to participate in a landmark, year-long program created by the LCLD to identify, train, and advance the next generation of leaders in the legal profession.




#### Class Reunion Planning

# **Hoban now accepting Cryptocurrency**

Hoban is one of the first schools in the area to accept donations of cryptocurrency! Donating crypto to Hoban saves you money on two types of taxes: 1. Avoid paying any capital gains tax (and state income taxes) on your crypto gains and 2. receive a full federal income tax deduction for the value of your crypto. An alternative is to sell your crypto and donate the cash proceeds, but you would first owe capital gains tax on the appreciation, resulting in higher taxes for you and less dollars going to furthering Hoban's Holy Cross mission. This
